## **Excerpt from the CBL/BCMBA Constitution**

### **Rule 15 – Manager, Coach, and Player Behavior – Code of Conduct**

15.01

#### **B C MINOR CODE OF CONDUCT**

BC Minor is committed to providing an environment in which all individuals are treated with respect. Furthermore, B C Minor Baseball supports equal opportunity and prohibits discriminatory practices. Members are expected to conduct themselves at all times in a manner consistent with the values of B C Minor Baseball. Members may be subject to sanctions according to B C Minor Baseball Discipline Policy for engaging in any of the following behavior.

#### **EXAMPLES OF MINOR INFRACTIONS**

- (a) a single incident of disrespectful, offensive, abusive, racist or sexist comments or behavior directed towards others, including but not limited to peers, opponents, athletes, coaches, officials, administrators, spectators and sponsors;
- (b) unsportsmanlike conduct such as angry outbursts or arguing;
- (c) non-compliance with the rules and regulations under which B C Minor Baseball events are conducted,
- (d) not complying with the rules, regulations or policies of BC Minor Baseball, as adopted and amended from time to time;
- (e) Deliberately disregarding the Rules of Baseball as amended from time to time;
- (f) Verbally or physically abusing an opponent, officials, umpires, spectators, or sponsors;
- (g) showing disrespect to officials, including the use of foul language and obscene or offensive gestures;
- (h) abusing playing equipment or playing area;
- (i) failing to comply with the conditions of entry of an event including any rules with regard to eligibility or advertising;
- (j) using tobacco products on-field at any B C Minor baseball sanctioned competition;
- (h) any other unreasonable conduct which brings the game into disrepute, including but not limited to, abusive use of alcohol, non-medical use of drugs, use of alcohol by minors.

The B C MINOR Code of Conduct shall govern all disciplinary matters to the extent that it conflicts with or augments the Code of Conduct of any Association 15.03

#### **EXAMPLES OF MAJOR INFRACTIONS**

- (a) repeated incidents or disrespectful, offensive, abusive, racist, or sexist, comments or behavior directed towards others, including but not limited to peers, opponents, athletes, coaches, officials, administrators, spectators and sponsors.
- (b) Playing under an assumed name, falsifying an affidavit or roster, or giving false information to tournament officials;
- (c) knowingly participating while ineligible;
- (d) knowingly competing with or against players who have been disqualified;

#### EXAMPLES OF MAJOR INFRACTIONS CON'T

- (e) repeated unsportsmanlike conduct such as angry outbursts or arguing;
- (f) activities or behavior which interfere with a competition or with any athlete's preparation for a competition;
- (g) pranks, jokes or other activities which endanger the safety of others;
- (h) deliberate disregard for the rules and regulations under which B C Minor Baseball events are conducted, whether at the local or provincial level;
- (i) abusive use of alcohol where abuse means a level of consumption which impairs the individual ability to speak, walk or drive; causes the individual to behave in a disruptive manner; or interferes with the individual's ability to perform effectively and safely;
- (j) any use of alcohol by minors (k) any use of illicit drugs and narcotics (l) use of banned performance enhancing drugs or methods (m) any physical contact with an umpire or other game official

#### Tobacco Products

The use of tobacco products, including smokeless tobacco, illegal substances and alcoholic beverages in any form, is prohibited on the playing field, benches, dugouts, or any area within the boundaries of the park by players, managers, coaches, umpires or any official. PENALTY: Automatic ejection from the game.

#### Behavior Expectations

Players, managers or coaches engaging or persisting in conduct or actions unfavorable to the spirit, principles and objectives of good sportsmanship shall receive one warning from the umpire. If the offense or offenses continue, offender or offenders will be removed from the game.

#### Power to Suspend

BCMBA shall have the power to suspend any coach, manager or other team official violating the provisions of Rule 15. A committee of three BCMBA Directors appointed by the BCMBA President must first hold a hearing where all parties have the opportunity to appear and be heard.

The hearing date and

location will be set by BCMBA and all affected parties must be given seven days written notice of the hearing.

#### Automatic Suspensions

Applies ONLY to Mosquito, Pee Wee, and Bantam Summer League Or Bantam AAA Single Season (does not apply for spring play or Midget)

- (a) Any manager, coach or player ejected from a game for any reason will be suspended for a minimum of one extra game of the teams next zone, summer league or single season league. NOTE - This rule shall not apply during a provincial tournament where each ejection will be reviewed on its merits and any further penalty decided by the BCMBA discipline committee. This decision, made by the BC Minor Director responsible for the tournament, can not be appealed.

## **Rule 16: BCMBA Director Power to intervene**

Power to intervene

Should an elected B.C.M.B.A. Director, League Executive member during League play or a Tournament Director or a B.C.M.B.A. Director, during Area, Zone or Provincial play-downs, in the best interests of the game, feel that an umpire or umpires have allowed any of the preceding violations to occur without issuing the applicable warning, may so issue the one warning to the umpire(s) and the participating coach.

If the offense or offenses continue and the umpire(s) not act on the warning issued, the elected B.C.M.B.A. Director, League Executive member or Tournament Director may remove the offender or offenders from the game.

Reporting

Should 16.01 be used as so indicated a written report must be filed with the governing League body and a copy forwarded to the Board of Directors of B.C.M.B.A. outlining the following:
